<u>Crossroads Ministry</u> — A Christian service agency helping Estes Valley residents in need by providing food, temporary housing assistance, Meals on Wheels and more, as well as assisting with self-sufficiency through educational opportunities and referrals to additional resources.

<u>Estes Valley Crisis Advocates</u> — A nonprofit agency serving survivors of a range of crises, from crime to fires to domestic violence, by providing first responder assistance followed by long-term advocacy, counseling, and support groups.

<u>Mission Co-Workers</u> — The church supports two PC(USA) Mission Co-Worker couples: Luta and Jeremy Garbat-Welch serving in Malawi, and Sara Armstrong/Rusty Edmonson serving in Peru.

<u>"Just Coffee"</u> — Monthly sales help support coffee farmers in Chiapas, Mexico. Also, the church has funded shallow wells in Malawi, Zambia and Tanzania and through second-mile giving provides help to the Embangweni School for the Deaf in Malawi.

<u>Salud Foundation</u> — Educates the community about Salud and raises funds to support the Health Center. The mission is to reduce disparities in health care between insured and uninsured in the Estes Valley.
