
of each month take the contributions to Crossroads. Please help in this ministry. Crossroads especially needs these items:

Pilgrimage News

On April 21st a group of church-goers from around the state, gathered at Highlands Camp to celebrate 24 years of a ministry called Colorado Presbyterian Cursillo/Pilgrimage. There was a lot to celebrate!

In the 1990's members of Colorado congregations travelled to Oklahoma to attend a retreat weekend called Presbyterian Cursillo. By 1999, there were enough Coloradans who had attended to bring the program back to Colorado. First Presbyterian Church of Colorado



Springs became the sponsoring church for *Colorado Presbyterian Cursillo*. Our first retreat weekend was held in September, 1999 at LaForet United Church of Christ camp in Black Forest, and had 40 staff members, mostly from Oklahoma, and 39 participants from two Colorado Presbyterian churches.

Weekend #2 had 42 staff and 40 participants from three Colorado Presbyterian churches and CPC #3 also had 40 participants from 5 Colorado Presbyterian Churches. It looked like this thing was going to go! So the leadership team adopted bylaws and structure from Oklahoma Cursillo and formed a council working within the sponsoring church to ensure that this ministry was done in Presbyterian order.

The first weekends were in the historic Ponderosa Lodge at La Foret with tables crammed wall to wall. Staff members sat on the steps or against the walls. Accommodations were bunks in rustic cabins with two bathrooms for 20 people. Ah, the bonding that went on there! LaForet had a beautiful mission-style chapel, which served as backdrop to many meaningful and memorable worship services. Cursillo made people glow with God's love.

By 2009, we had served 600 people from 20 Presbyterian Churches. At this point, Colorado Presbyterian Cursillo petitioned the <u>national</u> council to become **Colorado Presbyterian Pilgrimage** and our first Pilgrimage weekend (the 20th Colorado weekend) was held in October, 2009. As Pilgrimage, some Spanish words were dropped and participants who attended non-Presbyterian churches were allowed to attend.

In 2012, First Pres of Colorado Springs stopped being the sponsoring church, and First Pres of Leadville, CO took over. A consortium of churches including PCCR continued to put on weekends. (Our role was to store the tubs and tubs of supplies.). The weekend retreats have been held at Highlands Camp or Snow Mountain Ranch in Granby since 2014, except of course for two pandemic years when no retreats were held. The consortium was able to hold seven more weekends, serving 71 participants from 9 new participating churches and adding 18 new staff members who got the opportunity to serve.

As we made the difficult decision to "retire" the ministry (most of the worker bees are well beyond retirement age), we also decided to celebrate our accomplishments with one last party; to savor our memories and keep in touch with the friends we have made; to pass along our collection of supplies with our prayers and best wishes. (Some are going to Virginia Pilgrimage which lost all of it's supplies in a tragedy, some are going to a start-up church, some to a nonprofit, some to a preschool).

There are several areas of the country still holding Cursillo/Pilgrimage weekends and anyone who wants to attend a weekend may find one on the website: www.pilgrimagecursillo.org

The closest one to us is Great Plains Pilgrimage in Omaha. There is also a similar program right here in Colorado called *Koinonia* (<u>nckoinonia.org</u>). Many of us in Colorado will continue to be active, so without sadness we say farewell to *Colorado Presbyterian Pilgrimage*. Go with God.

Parking Lot Resurfacing

The church parking lot and driveway will be resurfaced to help preserve our investment in the paving. This will include crack sealing, sealcoating and restriping. To do this, portions of the parking lot will need to be closed for a few days at a time. We will only close half of the area at a time so the church will always be accessible.

It will all be done during the work week, so that everything will be open on Sundays. The schedule is:

Main west parking lot and west entrance will be closed: Tuesday, June 27th; Wednesday, June 28th and Thursday, June 29th. The east driveway and south and south-east parking lots will still be open.

South and south-east parking lots and drive near front door will be closed: Friday, June 30th and Saturday July 1st. The west driveway and main west parking lot plus the east driveway as far as the north parking lot (used by EPNRC) will still be open. The east driveway will not be closed at any time

Session Highlights – May 15, 2023

Heard from Finance Committee that we are doing well financially this year.

Noted that the Lifelong Learning Center has closed and that the Mission and Outreach Committee is searching for a similar non-profit agency that PCCR might support.
