**Sunday, July 17, 2022**



## **Message from Pastor Chris Davis . . .**

Dear PCCR Family,

It has been a year and a half since my first Sunday at PCCR. Where does the time go?!? It is a joy to be your Interim Pastor. This congregation has been so gracious, patient, and kind to me during the interim period and I want to take this opportunity to thank you for allowing me to serve as your Interim Pastor.

I also want to take this opportunity to give you an update on the interim process. As many of you know, the Presbyterian model for calling a new pastor can take time and requires several steps before a new pastor is able to arrive at PCCR. The first step in the process is a Mission Study Report. The mission study is a “window” into a congregation, and it briefly describes the community (Estes Park), church history, and vision for future ministry.

I am pleased to announce that at the May meeting of Session, your Ruling Elders approved PCCR’s Mission Study Report. I also want to thank the following individuals, whom Session approved, to write the Mission Study: Nancy Almond, Randy Brigham, Kent Meyer, Judy Schaffer, and Sue Yowell. Much of the information in the Mission Study Report was taken from an earlier document, PCCR’s 2019 Visioning Report. This work was completed by you just prior to COVID and Pastor Moore leaving the congregation. If you would like to read the Mission Study Report, please email the church and we will send you a copy or stop by the church office and pick one up.

The next step in the process will be for Presbytery’s Committee on Ministry (COM) to approve the Mission Study Report. This will take place at the June meeting of COM. Once approved, COM will grant permission for us to form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). PCCR’s Nominating Committee will develop a slate of candidates which will be approved at a future Congregational Meeting. Once we are approved to form our PNC, you will see nominating forms in consecutive worship bulletins, so please give prayerful consideration on who may be a good fit to serve on our PNC.

Now that the process to call your next pastor is in motion, I will be giving regular progress updates in the monthly newsletter. Please reach out to me with any questions; I am here to help! Also, let us keep our congregation in prayer as we listen for the Holy Spirit and God’s guidance during this exciting time in the life of our church.

## A Story About Vision

When I was 8 years old, the family went to a drive-in for lunch. Dad asked me “What do you want?” “What do they have?” “The menu is painted there on the wall.” “What wall?” And so I began to wear glasses all day, every day. But if I was an 8-year-old deaf child in Malawi, Africa, there would be no glasses. Most likely no one would even notice that I couldn’t see well and wouldn’t know how to fix it if they did notice.

Hope and new vision are beginning to come to Embangweni Schools for the Deaf! Thanks to the forward-looking hospital administrator, Mr. Mwawi Chirwa, teachers have been trained to recognize possible vision problems in their students. With some financial support from the PCCR Mission and Outreach Committee (that’s really from the congregation, you know) Mr. Chirwa organized a day of training and screening for the Primary and Secondary Schools for the Deaf which was held on May 7, 2022. Mr. Chirwa requested a Zoom meeting so he could report on the day; he and committee member Carol Nussbaumer met on May 11 and he reported the following:

The training began at 9 am (delayed by 1.5 hours due to a power blackout and resulting search for a generator and fuel). Teachers of the deaf filled in the time waiting for the generator by teaching the others some sign language; 32 people attended the meeting, including the head teachers from both schools, other teachers, and hospital staff.



Teachers watched a Power Point presentation showing normal vs damaged eyes, eye anatomy and development, signs of vision difficulty in learners, and services available at the Embangweni Mission Hospital eye clinic. A question and answer period followed and at 2 pm the activities moved to screening.



Seventy learners from the Primary School for the Deaf were screened (the total number enrolled is 190, but many older students were away at a previously scheduled football {soccer} match.) Forty-one of those screened were found to have vision problems.



All 86 learners from the Secondary School for the Deaf were screened; 4 were found to have vision problems. The question is: how many students at Primary school have not completed the course or have not done very well because of poor vision? What can be done about it?

Screening was offered to the teachers but only five accepted. Four of them were found to have vision problems, including the head teacher at Secondary School for Deaf.

A follow-up day at the hospital has been scheduled for treatment where appropriate and to fit glasses. The teachers were very appreciative and urged that this program be extended to the Bandawe School for the Deaf so they, too, can benefit.



Total cost for the day was \$196 (160,250.00 Malawi kwacha) which included building rental, generator fuel, refreshments (coke and cookies) and noon meal (these are expected at any Malawian meeting), training materials, a pen and writing pad for each teacher for note-taking.

## Pentecost Special Offering 2022

Once again, we are celebrating Pentecost, the birth of the Church, by taking an offering to help other people celebrate the birth in ways that Christ would approve. This is the second of the four national Presbyterian Church (PCUSA) special offerings taken each year. Unlike two of the other three special offerings where 1/4 of the offering stays with the local congregation, 40% stays with us for our use to support local entities while 60% goes for national causes. This year, the local non-profit that Mission and Outreach Committee has chosen to send our 40% to EVICS (Estes Valley Investment in Childhood Success) Family Resource Center.

### EVICS Family Resource Center

From diapers to helping a family start a business to ensure their future and the future of their children, the expanded services of EVICS seeks to help put families on their feet and to allow them to become a healthy and contributing member of the Estes Park community. It is the fruition of the dreams of former Executive Director Nancy Almond, member of PCCR (now retired). Housed in a conveniently located, warm, friendly and sunny office, it is a "happy, busy place" to be and to visit.

Among the services provided on site are a closet full of diapers for those who are in need of that commodity, screenings for children ages 1 month to 6 years, and family advocates who help a family assess the needs of the entire family and work with family members and other entities to meet those needs.

The center has partnered with many other community entities such as Crossroads for food needs, the Library and McDonald Bookstore for story time, the school district for scholarships, the Town Board for family-oriented changes and additions to benefit a family's lives in the community, and many others including PCCR. PCCR allows the use of their basement for twice-a-week ESL (English as a Second Language) classes in our lower level.

They also make referrals to meet other needs that might be present with the families that EVICS cannot supply itself. It might even include using the natural skills and expertise of the clients. This often translates into help setting up a business, such as home childcare to a sewing and clothing design. EVICS has now evolved into a whole family-oriented agency, not just a child-centered one. With the help of EVICS, these families will be a great asset to our community, pulling their weight and contributing. The children of these families will lead a productive life in their own right and so on into the next generations.

I will close with a quote from our own Jan Boatman, President of the Board of Directors of EVICS.

*"It takes a village to successfully raise a child, and in the Estes Valley EVICS Family Resource Center is an integral part of the village. I spent my career in the area of Early Childhood Education and know the importance of children having a good early start of nutrition, stimulation, education, and love. In order for the children to have these things they need to have an environment where their caregivers have resources and support. I have been involved with EVICS FRC because I want to be a part of an organization that truly supports the whole family and therefore gives the children the best chance to grow into healthy, happy, successful adults."* Jan Boatman, President EVICS FRC Board of Directors

### PCUSA

National Church, from their portion, 25% of the offering goes to support Young Adult Volunteers (YAV), serving in communities around the world, and growing as leaders transformative Christian service. Many of these young people go on to seminary and become Presbyterian pastors and serve the church all the rest of their working lives because of this experience. We have had the services of some of these young pastors in our Presbytery.

Another 25% of the national share supports Ministries with Youth to guide our young people by uniting them in Christ and lifting them up as leaders and messengers of God's work in their own right.


