Hymn Tidbits

(Researched by Joan Buhlmann)

#430 - "Come Sing, O Church, in Joy!"

Come Sing, O Church in Joy (1988) is by Dr. Brian Kenneth Dill (b. 1949), a Presbyterian minister who wrote this hymn for the 1989 bicentennial of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Dr. Dill is Assoc. Pastor in Lakeland FL. The tune Darwall was composed by John Darwall of Staffordshire, England (1731-1789). It was published as a setting for Ps. 148 (1770). Darwall became the curate and later vicar of St. Matthew's Parish in Walsall. He was a poet and amateur musician.

#388 - "O Jesus, I Have Promised"

This hymn is by John E. Bode (1816-1874), educated at Eton and Oxford. Taking Holy Orders in 1841, he became Rector of Westwell, Oxfordshire, 1847. He was also for a time Tutor of his College, and Classical Examiner. His Bampton Lectures were delivered in 1855. In addition to his Lectures, and Ballads from Herodotus, he published Hymns from the Gospel of the Day for each Sunday and Festivals of our Lord, 1860; and Short Occasional Poems, London, 1858. Bode wrote the words for his daughter's and two sons' confirmation service. At the time, Bode was a pastor in Castle Camps parish, Cambridgeshire. It was published in the appendix of Psalms and Hymns of the Society for the Propagation of Christian Knowledge. The text is from Ps. 119:57. The tune is Angel's Story by Arthur H. Mann (1850 Norwich, Morfol-1929 Cambridge) He graduated from New College, Oxford, Music.D. 1882, and was assistant organist at Norwich Cathedral. He became organist at King's College Chapel, Cambridge (1876-1929), University Organist (1897-1929), and music master and organist at the Leys School, Cambridge (1894-1922). He was music editor of the Church of England Hymnal (1894).

#411 - "Arise, Your Light Is Come!"

This hymn is based on Isaiah 40:31 and 60:1-2. It was composed by William H. Walter, 1894, with the lyrics by Dr. Ruth Duck, 1974, and is a hymn for Epiphany.
