MEDITATION AND *HYMN OF THE DAY No. 316 "Breathe on Me, Breath of God"

*Affirmation of Faith (Unison) from the Confession of 1967

God's sovereign love is a mystery beyond the reach of the human mind. Human thought ascribes to God superlatives of power, wisdom, and goodness. But God reveals divine love in Jesus Christ by showing power in the form of a servant, wisdom in the folly of the cross, and goodness in receiving sinful human beings. Hymn Tidbits

#2223—"They'll Know We Are Christians By Our Love"

We Are One in the Spirit is by Fr. Peter <u>Scholtes</u> (1938 Evanston IL-2009). He led a youth choir out of the basement where he was a parish priest at St. Brendan's on the South side of Chicago in the 1960s. His experiences there and in the Chicago Civil Rights Movement influenced him for the rest of his life. He traveled the globe helping businesses engage employees' talents more fully, humanely, and effectively. He wrote The Team Handbook and The Leader's Handbook in 1968.

#316—"Breathe on Me, Breath of God"

This hymn is by Edwin Hatch (1836-1939) of Darby, England. Placed in hundreds of hymnals, it reflects the powerful and overwhelming invitation of God's spirit into the body. It encapsulates a deep desire to be renewed in Christ, and purified by the Holy Spirit. The tune Trentham by Robert Jackson (1842-1914) of Lancashire is named for a village in Staffordshire near where Jackson was born.

#335—"Though I May Speak"

This hymn (1972) is by Hal H. Hopson, 1933, who was born in Mound, TX and now resides in Dallas. A renowned clinician and composer, he has published more than 1300 compositions. He held posts at Westminster Church in Nashville, Preston Hollow Presbyterian in Dallas, and taught at Westminster Choir College, Princeton, and at Scarritt Graduate School in Nashville. His "God with Us" was chosen to be placed in a time capsule in Washington during the bicentennial in 1976 to be opened in 100 years. "The Gift of Love" paraphrases 1 Cor. 13:1-3 as does the melody as an adaptation of the folk melody "O Waly, Waly." The original tune was collected by American folksong specialist Cecil Sharp (1906).
